
The Center for Consumer Law Files Amicus Brief in Arbitration Matter

he Center for Consumer Law recently filed an amicus brief on behalf of contract law professors, in the matter of *Buckeye Check Cashing v. Cardegna*, arguing against the enforcement of an arbitration clause contained in an illegal and void predatory lending contract.
